

PURCHASE ORDER ATTACHMENT IN-006

FOREIGN OFFSET CREDIT PROPOSAL

- I. Raytheon Company products and/or services are purchased by many countries throughout the free world to meet their commercial and defense requirements. Doing business with most foreign countries requires a reciprocal obligation to buy, as a percentage of the contract value, products or services from those foreign countries. This negotiated sum is generally referred to as an "offset".
 - II. Offsets can be described as either "direct" or "indirect". First consideration is usually given to direct offset, that is, buying from the foreign country some portion of the product or services being sold by Raytheon Company to that country. Indirect offsets, that is, offsets not related to the products or services being sold to that foreign country, are often feasible.
 - III. A. OFFSET. Raytheon Company has, or anticipates having, offset commitments to the Government(s) of . In addition, buyer has offset obligations in the following countries:

 - B. Offeror agrees that any resultant purchase order will be issued with the intent of Buyer claiming offset credit. Raytheon Company will be permitted to be the sole claimant of offset credit for such subcontracts and Offeror, if requested, agrees to support Raytheon Company in obtaining credit from the appropriate government agencies.
 - C. As part of its proposal, Offeror commits to procuring products and services in the countries identified above, herein to the aggregate percentage of _____ of the total value of the proposal. The countries in which these procurements will be made are noted below: (list countries)
- IV. If a purchase order is awarded to Offeror, Offeror will provide the following information to the Buyer within 30 calendar days after the completion of each calendar quarter during the term of any order:
 - A. Solicitations offered during the calendar quarter to industry by the country(s) listed in III. above, that did not result in awards including:
 1. Item
 2. Value in U.S. dollars
 3. Date of solicitation
 - B. Subcontracts or orders placed with countries other than the United States including:
 1. Item
 2. Value in U.S. dollars (including changes in value, as issued)
 3. Competitive or noncompetitive
 4. Date of Award
 5. Identification and location of subcontractor
 6. Changes to reported subcontracts that affect the subcontract amount.
 - C. Status of deliveries under subcontracts placed under B. above.

The text of this document shall not be changed except by written agreement between Buyer and Seller.
